- the surgery explained as it happens
- to watch the birth
- skin-to-skin contact asap
- to try breastfeeding asap
- the baby exposed to vaginal fluids
- double-layer sutures are preferred •

- my team would love to cut the umbilical cord •
- delayed cord-clamping
- please save: blood and cord
- please send a lactation consultant in asap after birth
- myself or someone from my team with baby during any treatments or tests
- please delay all procedures 12–24 hours after birth
- · baby to stay in my room at all times

Please DO NOT give: sugar water, formula, pacifier, Hep B vaccine, bath

If baby is not doing well, I would like:

- to accompany baby to the NICU or another facility
- to try breastfeeding or to provide pumped milk
- to hold baby whenever possible

Postpartum, I would like:

limited visitors, ice packs, to wear my own clothes, Depends and/or heavy duty pads, to stay in the hospital as long as possible
